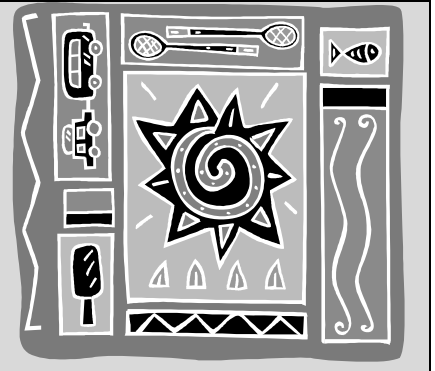

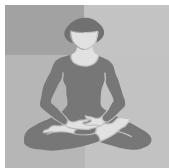
1. Life isn't fair, but it's still good
